In this month's prayer intention, Pope Francis invites us to pray for the pastoral care for the sick. **Pope Francis** lifts up his prayer that the sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick might become more and more a "visible sign of compassion and hope."

In his video message – produced in collaboration with the <u>Archdiocese of Los</u> <u>Angeles</u> – the **Pope** insists that it "is not a sacrament only for those who are at the point of death," but states that it "is one of the 'sacraments of healing,' of 'restoration,' that heals the spirit."
