# World Day of Prayer for Migrants and Refugees

The Church has been celebrating the World Day of Migrants and Refugees (WDMR) since 1914. It is always an occasion to express concern for different vulnerable people on the move; to pray for them as they face many challenges; and to increase awareness about the opportunities that migration offers.

Every year the WDMR is the last Sunday of September; in 2024 it will be celebrated on 29 September. As the title for his annual message, the Holy Father has chosen "God walks with His people". In this message, the Holy Father reminds us that **all of us, God's people, are migrants on this earth**, on our way to the "true homeland", the Kingdom of Heaven. Migrants are a contemporary icon of this people on a journey, of the Church on a journey, and at the same time, it is in them and in all our vulnerable brothers and sisters that we can encounter the Lord who walks with us.





**Friday 4 October** is the CAFOD Family Fast Day. This is a day when we can pray, give, and eat simply in solidarity with our global family.

Daniel, a young man in Democratic Republic of Congo, is carving a better future for his family with carpentry skills he learned in a CAFOD-funded training centre. What we do: Keep alive the vision of the parish and encourage and support its implementation.

The team has met several times this year to discuss how we can bring our Parish Vision into Action. We've been considering 5 main areas of parish life: Worship, Evangelisation, Community, Ministry and Discipleship.

These have been identified as being particularly relevant for parish renewal, moving from a community principally concerned with Maintenance to one which is focused on Mission.

The team met on Wednesday evening and discussed priorities for the future. Three things emerged: House groups, The Society of St Vincent de Paul (SVP) and Parish Website & Welcome pack/booklet.

**House Groups** Living as a faithful Catholic Christian in today's world is increasingly challenging. We all need support to grow in faith and to be more confident disciples of the Lord. Praying with others, sharing our faith and supporting each other when we face challenges are all important. We already have several small groups of parishioners, and others, who meet regularly to do just this. We would like to offer more opportunities for others to meet and we will be looking at ways in which this could become a reality.

**The SVP** We already have an SVP group within the parish. A small group of dedicated parishioners support those in our community, and beyond, who need help and friendship. The membership of the group is getting older and needs to be bolstered by new faces. In other parishes there are also Youth SVP groups. We would like to promote the work of the SVP, get others involved and consider inviting our young people to offer themselves for this ministry.

**Website and Welcome** We have a <u>fantastic parish website</u>. It's informative, friendly and welcoming, but it's a challenge to keep it up to date and relevant. It's often how people are introduced to the community, so we want it to reflect who we are and what we do. We would also like to create a welcome/information pack which lets people know what's going on in the parish and how they can get involved.

Please keep all these things in your prayers. We'll keep you up to date with developments and we're always really pleased to hear your ideas.
