

32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

"God does not have favourites", Saint Paul tells us, but God always makes a special place for the poor, and those whom society would push into second place. In the traditions of Israel God invited the people to have special care for the "widows and orphans" - so the story we hear in today's Gospel would have a particular resonance. The paradox of Christian faith is this: in giving, we receive. Christ gave everything, sacrificing his very life, and in return received a new and unending life. The widow in the first reading gave her last food for the prophet Elijah, and in return received an endless supply. This is a challenge to us in our turn: what are we invited or asked to give, and in what spirit will we do so, and what will be our reward?

Bishop-elect Philip Moger

The following is a statement from Bishop-elect Philip Moger regarding his installation: "In the very last few days, concerns have been raised of a personal nature to which I must attend immediately. This will take a little time. I have therefore agreed with all directly concerned to delay my installation as the new Bishop of Plymouth until these processes have been completed. I sincerely regret this delay and offer my apologies to all who are disappointed and inconvenienced. However it is important that everything is properly in place and due process observed. While this process takes place no further comment will be made."

Canon Paul Cummins will continue in his role as Diocesan Administrator. The mission of the Diocese to proclaim the Good News will still go on as before, with your support. Please keep Bishop-elect Philip, our Diocesan Administrator and our Diocese in your prayers.

Dignity of Human Life

Holy Hour Wednesday 13 November 5.30pm

Cardinal Vincent Nichols has called for Catholics in England and Wales to join him, and the bishops of our countries, to pause for an hour at 5.30pm on Wednesday, 13 November to pray for the dignity of human life.

On that day, the bishops will pause for an hour in the middle of their autumn plenary meeting to kneel in front of the Blessed Sacrament for a holy hour in light of the bill passing through the UK parliament that seeks to legalise assisted suicide. Opposing Assisted Suicide

The Bishop's Conference are calling on Catholics in England and Wales to unite in prayer and compassionate action to oppose assisted suicide. Follow this link, where you will find resources laying out the Catholic position on assisted suicide, and what you can do to stop its legalisation. There is also a link to contact your MP via the Right to Life website. Please also see the posters in the porch.

Society for the Protection of Unborn Children

A Bill to allow assisted suicide will be laid before Parliament this month. If passed, it would cause a complete change in the way society deals with terminally and chronically ill people.

People must be treated as equal in value and dignity and not as lives 'not worth living.' Assisted Suicide would place pressure on vulnerable people. Most palliative care doctors denounce these measures. Palliative Care is the Cinderella of the NHS and will remain so if assisted suicide is introduced.

This will give you information on what to include in your letter and invites you to enter your postcode which will bring up your MP and allow you to write an email which they will send.
