
# PARISH NEWS

In the East, this Season of Christmas is called the Time of Manifestation, or Showing. Today is the 'Feast of the Manifestation', or the Showing of the Saviour to all nations. In the wise men who travel from the East, we see all nations being welcomed at the New Temple of the New Covenant - the child in the manger.

Remember that for the people of Israel this was to be their Messiah, come to restore their fortunes. By this feast, we proclaim God's plan was to extend his salvation to men and women of every nation, of every time and every place - including us. # THE WORD

#### Sunday 5 January – The Epiphany of the Lord

First Reading Isaiah 60:1-6. The glory of the Lord has risen upon you.

Psalm Response All the nations on earth shall fall prostrate before you, O Lord.

Second Reading Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6.

It has now been revealed that the Gentiles are fellow heirs of the promise. **Gospel** Matthew 2:1-12. We have come from the east to worship the king.

#### Sunday 12 January – The Baptism of the Lord

First Reading Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 Behold my servant, in whom my soul delights. Psalm Response The Lord will bless his people with peace. Second Reading Acts 10:34-38 God anointed Jesus with the Holy Spirit. Gospel Luke 3:15-15, 21-22 When Jesus had been baptized and was praying, the heavens were opened.

## The Adoration of the Magi – Hieronymus Bosch c. 1499



This gorgeous depiction of the visit of the Magi, the wise men from the East is one of my favourites. Unusually, three of the characters, Mary, Jospeh and one of the Magi, possibly Melchior, are all clothed in rich pink. The colour lends the scene a quality of softness and gentleness.

Balthasar kneels in front of Jesus and offers his gift which the baby is clearly keen to get his hands on! The king has placed his crown on the ground in a gesture of deference to this newborn king.

Mary is the picture of serenity as she gently holds Jesus, not possessively, but almost offering him to these strange visitors, and the world.

Joseph is depicted as an older man. He scratches his head, confused at the wonders he is witnessing. He is also worried about how to care for this new family who are in danger from Herod's jealousy and power. Remember they will have to flee to Egypt.

The stable is only just standing, a depiction of the poverty of the birth of God's Son, but also an image of the falling away of the old order and the establishment of the new kingdom. The bare tree could be a symbol of the tree of the Cross.

The town in the background doesn't look much like Bethlehem; it's a depiction of a Northern European city, one with which the painter would have been more familiar.

Paintings such as these are full of rich symbolism and meaning. This enabled those who were lucky enough to see them, many of whom would have been illiterate, to meditate upon the image and come to a deeper understanding of the mysteries of God's loving plan of salvation. May it continue to help us today.
