

Statement from Bishop Philip Moger

Canon Paul Cummins, our Diocesan Administrator writes: As you will remember, back in November Bishop Philip issued a statement postponing his installation as the Bishop of Plymouth. He has now written a follow-up statement which reads:

"At the beginning of November 2024, just before I was to begin my ministry in Plymouth, I let it be known that concerns of a personal nature had been raised, to which I had to attend immediately. This has taken longer than I anticipated. All things considered; I have come to the decision to present to the Holy Father a request to step down from my appointment as Bishop of the Diocese of Plymouth. The Holy Father has accepted my request. For the immediate future I will be taking a sabbatical: a time of prayer and personal reflection, the next stage on the journey of my ministry. I realise, with regret, that this leaves a continuing vacancy in the Diocese of Plymouth. I assure the lay faithful, clergy and religious of the Diocese of my good wishes and prayers and ask the same of them for me."

This news may come as a shock and a disappointment to you, as I am sure that like me you were looking forward to having a bishop in post. I expect that you may have some questions, but this statement from Bishop Philip is all the information that I have for you. Please continue to keep Bishop Philip in your prayers particularly at this time, and pray for those who will be a part of the selection process for our new bishop. Please also keep Pope Francis in your prayers as he struggles with ill health.

Thank you so much for all your support. Please continue to keep me, and our Diocese, in your prayers. Canon Paul.

The Season of Lent

Lent is the annual penitential season when we prepare spiritually for the celebration of Easter. As Jesus spent 40 days in the desert facing and resisting temptation, so we enter this season facing up to the reality of our sinfulness and committing to change. We know we cannot do this alone, so we pray for the grace of the Holy Spirit to enable us to ask for forgiveness and open our hearts to the love and mercy of God.

Shrove Tuesday

Traditionally named after the 'shriving' (forgiving) of the people. Mass will be celebrated at 6.30pm followed by pancakes in the St Richard Reynolds Centre. We will be burning last year's palms to make the ash for the next day. All welcome.

Ash Wednesday

Mass with the distribution of ashes will be celebrated at 9.30am and 7.00pm. We hope that these times will enable as many of you as possible to celebrate Mass and begin this penitential season. As we mark our foreheads with ash, we show that we are prepared to accept our sinfulness and ask for God's forgiveness.

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence. Please try to fast from some food and abstain from eating red meat.

We Dare to Hope – Sharing Faith in Lent

Lent Retreat Day Saturday 15 March at St Rita's Centre


"Who am I? A tourist or a pilgrim?" by Fr Ignatius Paul Raj
