

We hear the call of another prophet this week – Isaiah. This introduces the Gospel, where we hear Jesus calling his first disciples to follow him. Notice that the initiative is Jesus': there is no application process or interview procedure! Notice also the way that Jesus calls his disciples in this account – not with words, but with a miracle that is also a parable. It is, in a way, a miraculous 'job description': if the disciple trusts completely in the one who calls, then the result will be truly amazing – a huge catch of men and women hungry for God. Simon's simple words "if you say so" give us an example of Christian discipleship: we should leave our own concerns behind, and simply follow the Lord with great trust.

Feast of St Josephine Bakhita 8 February

St Josephine Bakhita is the patron saint of victims of modern slavery and human trafficking. Josephine Margaret Bakhita was a Sudanese-Italian Canossian religious sister who lived in Italy for 45 years, after having been a slave in Sudan. In 2000 she was declared a saint.

On her Feast Day we are encouraged to pray for those affected by the crimes of modern slavery and human trafficking, and the people that volunteer and work to eradicate this crime.
